





### Addressing the Needs of Our Community

Food security exists when all people, at all times, have physical and economic access to sufficient, safe and nutritious food that meets their dietary needs for an active and healthy life. Sadly, this is not the case for many families in our community and that is why we do Food Hampers twice a year, and opened the Sharing Cupboard in January 2023. Our continued commitment to providing our families with food and basic hygiene supplies simply reinforces Jesus'

statement to the Pharisees ," Love your neighbour as yourself".

And so we continue - the Sharing Cupboard opens every two weeks. Some weeks are busier than others but consistency is such an important part of outreach. Our Annual Christmas Hamper Campaign has begun with 25 hampers being delivered on December 16. It is also important to note that we are in

#### A CHRISTMAS MESSAGE

Many years ago, a brilliant mathematician, Archimedes, worked on the principle of the lever. He said that if he could find a lever long enough, and a pivot located strategically somewhere out in space, he could, himself, lift up the world. Theoretically, apparently, he was right. In practice, though, he was not able to do it!

However, by the power of God's work alive in the world, it has happened in a way for all of us to see. God accomplished it not with a lever but with a lover: and that work of love came to the world in the event we choose to celebrate at Christmas time. Once upon a Christmas time, God began to lift up the world through the power and glory of sacred love. This Christmas story, called Nativity, is not only a tale of long ago and far away. where voices can be raised in praise to the God who is our Maker, Defender, Redeemer and Friend. It is in places where Holy Spirit comes and invests itself in human spirit. It is wherever we find and know ourselves being lifted up in love by a power that the world, on its own, cannot provide.

Our church is not a palace. It is just a simple place, not unlike a little stable. And it was in a very simple setting that something very special happened a long time ago, and still happens at Christmas time and all the time. It is God's work of love in Christ and Christ's love at work in us ... ever ancient, ever new ...Body of Christ!!

And angel voices still sing gladly within our midst: Glory to God in the highest... and on earth ... **PEACE!** 

And the miracle of Christmas will be remembered and celebrated deeply in a beloved and simple setting, our church, this year, as always, ever old and ever new.
